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What To Expect After Your New Tintz

Drying Time

Your tint film can take a few weeks to fully bond to the glass. **Avoid rolling your windows down for 2–3 days** until the film has dried, as this can cause the film to peel.

Cleaning

Clean your tinted windows with a soft cloth or white paper towel (avoid brown, scratchy towels). Do **not** use ammonia-based cleaners like Windex unless they are labeled ammonia-free, as ammonia can cause the film to become hazy or blotchy over time. If needed, use mild soap and water instead.

Black Dotted Edges

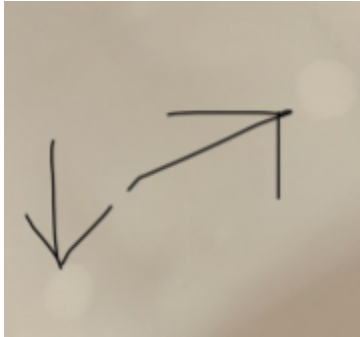
Some rear windshields and quarter windows may have a black ceramic “frit” edge. This edge can be flat or made up of raised ceramic dots. Since these dots are thicker than the surrounding glass, the tint film may not fully adhere between them, creating a slight whitish border around the edge. This is a normal characteristic of the glass and not a tint installation defect.

Seat Belt Chips

Caution should be used when releasing seat belts. Small chips can be made in the window film due to the seat belt hitting the glass as it is released.

Water Bubbles

During the drying process, you may notice grey, cloudy bubbles underneath the tint, and the windows may appear slightly hazy. This is caused by moisture trapped between the glass and film and is completely normal. The haze and water bubbles will gradually disappear as the film cures, usually within a week depending on temperature.



Do not squeegee or poke the bubbles. During warmer months, parking your vehicle outdoors in the sunlight can help speed up the drying process.

Cold Weather

In the winter, do not roll down windows until vehicle is fully defrosted otherwise it could make your film peel up from the bottom.

Imperfections

Though we strive for perfection in our installations, due to the nature of the product, some degree of dust contamination and/or minor imperfections are present in every window film application.

Pre-Existing Scratches

If your vehicle had any pre-existing scratches in the glass from dirt and debris buildup inside the window seals, these may become more noticeable after tint installation. The tint installation process does **not** cause these scratches.

The darker appearance of the tinted glass creates a black background effect, making existing imperfections easier to see than they were before.
